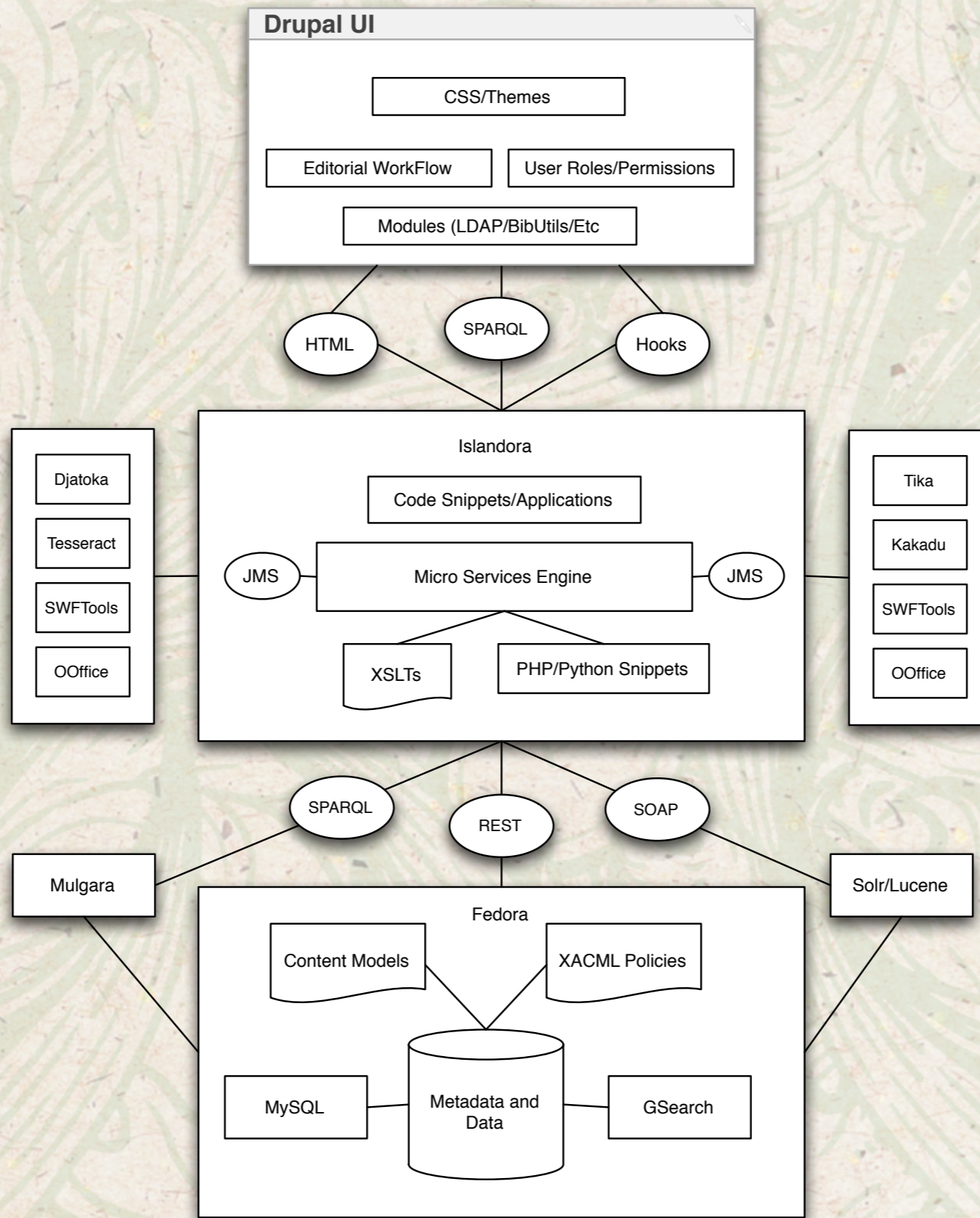

Islandora 101

- Drupal+Fedora+Other OS = framework
- Flexible UI on top of Fedora + other apps
- Support for 180+ languages via Drupal
- Desire to provide stronger preservation features and services as well as rich UI
- VM/code, documentation, lists, Camps



Key Components

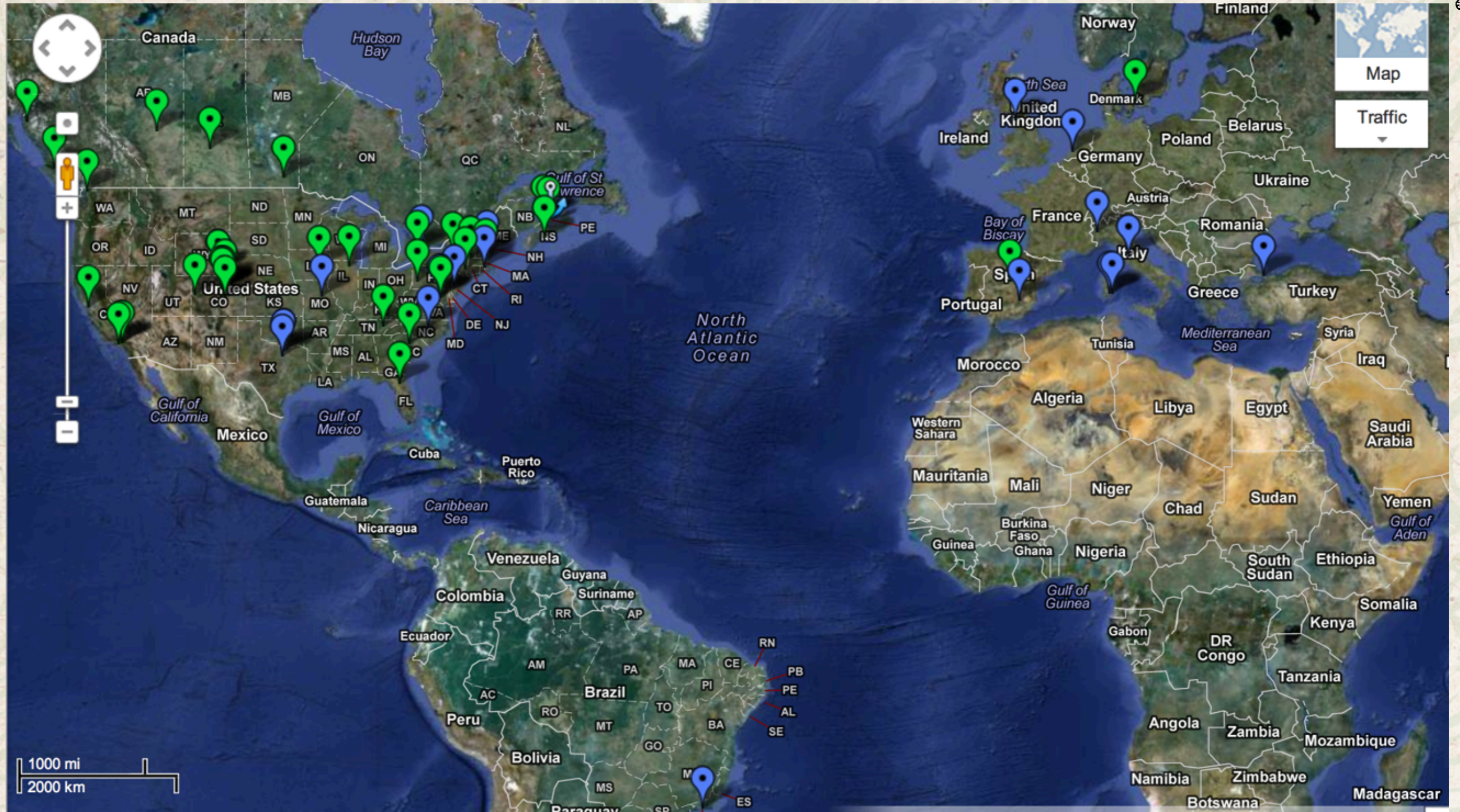
- Core modules (Tuque, Solr, etc.)



then heuristics and dendrogram analysis identified a reduced sign set to be incorporated in a diagnostic decision support tool implemented as a simple colour-banded card. One hundred and seventy disease-sign questionnaire returns were obtained from 32 veterinary research scientists and 14 veterinary practitioners. Preliminary validation of the decision support tool for 16 prototypical cases resulted in 'correct' diagnosis over 90% of the time. The card potentially serves as a training aid and aide-memoire, and could improve the diagnostic competence of animal healthcare providers.

III *A Review of the Founding and Development of the University of Toronto as a Provincial Institution*

By REV. DR. N. BURWASH,
(Read May 25, 1905.)

Introductory Note.

This review does not attempt a complete history of the University of Toronto. It is intended to trace the successive steps by which the present relation of the university to the higher education of the province as maintained by the state has been reached. This involved at first a conflict of political and ecclesiastical forces, and finally a harmonious co-operation on terms of mutual independence. The Province of Manitoba has already founded its university upon the same basis, and the other western provinces are likely to follow in the same line. Several states of the American Union have also made inquiries as to the success of the system. It is therefore thought that such a review may be of present interest.

The Founding and Endowment of the University of Toronto.

The Province of Upper Canada was founded under the Constitutional Act of 1791. During the preceding seven or eight years, a United Empire Loyalist population had been settling on the banks of the St. Lawrence, on the shores of the Bay of Quinté, in the Niagara Peninsula and on the coast of Lake Erie. When the government of the province was organized its population numbered about sixty-five thousand.

The first governor of the new province was Col. John Graves Simcoe, who had been a conspicuous leader of the Loyalist volunteers during the revolutionary war. His early life and education were those of an English country gentleman of the eighteenth century, and his ideas and tastes corresponded with the age and with the environment of his youth. He looked forward to the development in the new province of the same social conditions as existed in the old land; and, accordingly, in taking thought for the well-being of the young colony proposed to himself that provision should be made out of public funds for the maintenance of religion and the promotion of higher education. This religion was to be Protestant, as that of the adjoining Province of Lower Canada was

support was to be furnished from one seventh of the lands of the country. From the public lands also was to be derived a fund for the education especially of "the more respectable class of people by the erection of free grammar schools, and in course of time of a college or university."

In these views the Imperial Government readily concurred. As the province was surveyed, every seventh lot of land in each township was set apart for "the support of the Protestant clergy." The educational part of Simcoe's programme was not carried into effect until after his departure from the country. In response to an address from the Legislative Council and House of Assembly asking "an appropriation of the waste lands of the crown for the establishment and support of a respectable grammar school in each district and also a college or university where the youth of the country may be enabled to perfect themselves in the different branches of liberal knowledge," His Majesty, under date of November 4th, 1797, expressed his intention of complying with their wishes. "First, by the establishment of free grammar schools in those districts in which they are called for. Secondly, in due course of time by the establishment of other seminaries of a larger and more comprehensive nature for the promotion of religious and moral learning and the study of the arts and sciences." This message was communicated to the House of Assembly on the 8th of June, 1798, together with a request from the Colonial Secretary for the appointment of a committee of the Executive Council, the judges and the law officers of the Crown to report on the extent and character of the appropriations to be made. This committee recommended that five hundred thousand acres of land should be devoted to educational purposes, of which one-half should be reserved for the university, and that the university should be located at York, and that, at certain places named, grammar schools should be established. About this time accordingly, grammar schools were founded at Kingston and Cornwall, and, a little later, at Niagara and York. But the lands set apart for these purposes were as yet unproductive; and no funds were forthcoming for the support of the schools. When in 1809 the Legislature again turned its attention to the subject, and founded four new grammar schools, provision for maintenance had to be made from sources other than the land endowment. Meanwhile the more pressing needs of education were met by the establishment through purely voluntary efforts of elementary schools, which received legislative recognition for the first time in the Act of 1816.

In view of the condition of the colony and the unproductive nature of the endowment, it is not astonishing that the more ambitious scheme

If the moisture content of our local pack could be sufficiently reduced then an additional market might be available for the above mentioned product.

The lobster market is in a strong position at the present time as stocks of both frozen and fresh pack has been practically all sold. The lobster industry in some areas is experiencing extreme difficulties due to small catches. It is felt that trap limits and license control might work toward improving conditions for lobster fishermen. It has been reported that draggers working in the lobster fishing areas have incurred damage to lobster trap lines and that it is necessary to restrict dragger fishing during the lobster fishing season.

The crab fishing industry appears to hold considerable promise for fishermen in certain areas of the Island and may work in well for off-season employment for lobster fishermen. Markets for crab meat are improving and reduction in crab population should work toward improvement of the lobster situation.

This Committe recommends that the Provincial Government extend the present mortgage time limits in 60' and 65' wooden draggers owned by Prince Edward Island fishermen and presently in operation to a period not less than 15 years.

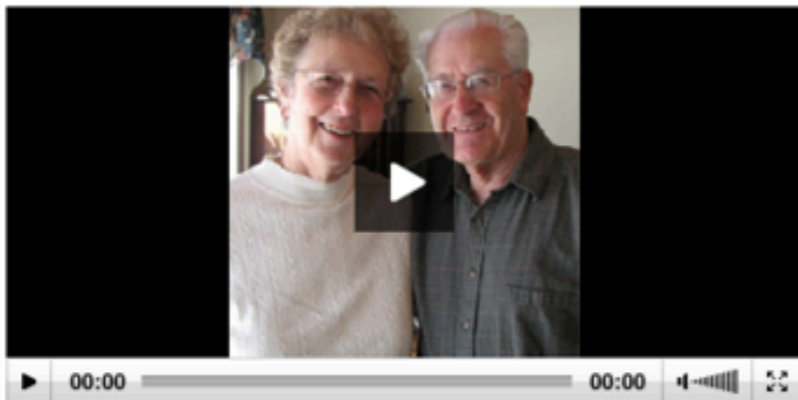
What is Island Voices?

Formal Training for Nurses, the Beginning

Before the emergence of formal training for nurses in Canada, nursing skills were passed down from one generation to the next by female relatives and neighbours through both verbal instruction and compiled manuals of domestic and herbal remedies. With the advancement of industrial and urban growth, along with advances in medicine in the late nineteenth century, it became more and more difficult for female relatives to care for the sick in their homes unless they could afford to obtain medical and surgical care. Those who could not afford to obtain medical and surgical care in their home were often sent to a hospital for treatment. These hospitals were usually financed through charitable funding, had low medical standards, and were generally staffed by working class women who had no formal training as nurses. In fact, many of the women only became nurses because they had been dismissed from their previous employment due to drunkenness and misbehaviour, as nursing was not generally considered a desirable employment.

In the late nineteenth century many hospitals began to transform their image from a place that generally only cared for the lower classes of society because of their low medical standards, to places of successful medical care that would serve all classes of society. In order to allow this transformation to occur, it became evident that something needed to be done so that the hospitals would be staffed with qualified and competent staff. The result was the establishment of training schools for nurses where students would be taught the proper procedures for patient care. Dr. Theophilus Mack established the first nursing school in Canada in 1874 at Mackis General and Marine Hospital in St. Catharines, Ontario. In Nova Scotia the first training school for nurses opened in 1890 at the [Victoria General Hospital](#) in Halifax.

At first enrolments in nursing schools were very small, but by the beginning of the twentieth century it became apparent that the hospital trained nurse would dominate the field and the number of nursing schools and nursing students quickly increased. The greatest expansion of nursing schools in Canada occurred in the first three decades of the twentieth century. In 1901 there were 65 nursing schools across the country and a total
