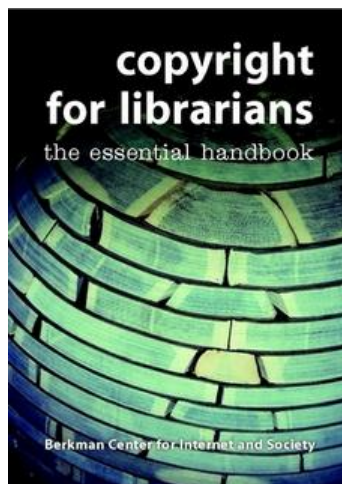


## Copyright for Librarians - the essential handbook
